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# Supported Decision-Making Agreements: What are they?

<u>Supported Decision-Making Agreement-</u> The formal process of documenting who an individual wants to support them, in what areas of life, and how they want to be supported.

### Comprised of:

- Principal/ Decision Maker
- Supporter(s)
- o Facilitator (optional)

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### Roles and Responsibilities of those in Supported Decision-Making Agreements

#### **Decision Maker**

- Make your own decisions
- Self-determination and dignity of risk
- Select who you want as Supporters, when you receive help and how you
   receive help
- Change or cancel your Supported Decision-Making Agreement at any time

#### Supporter

- Be available
- Know they do not make decisions
- Provide honest and fair information
- Understand dignity of risk
- Not offer advice or help if not asked for
- Not provide advice about things that could be a conflict of interest and/or they do not know about
- Take into consideration your feelings, needs, and things you like
- Respect privacy and information
  - Help plan and get supports and services

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## Abuse and Exploitation

Protocol for Addressing Abuse and Exploitation: Supporters agree to not use their position to abuse, exploit, manipulate, neglect, or provide undue influence on you. Should you have concerns, discuss these with someone you trust (another Supporter, your Supported Decision-Making Facilitator, your service providers, or another trusted adult) and contact Adult Protective Services, if needed. If abuse, exploitation, or neglect is evident, contact Adult Protective Services and emergency services (911), as appropriate.
